

• Improving intended use data collection at the time of checkout.



- How did site pull data for the multi-year plan?
- Can crops be defined in the accession dataview for reporting purposes? What level of detail
 captures the metrics that reflect what the stakeholders need to know about the collection
 maintained by the NPGS.

Minutes

- Intended Use data collection:
 - Add more questions during checkout? (eg. Short survey?)
 - CLONAL: Form type?
 - Click buttons! Don't type text
 - Do you (the recipient) have questions about how to maintain / grow the material?
 - Current categories are not useful and do not cover all use cases.
 - Intended use sub-categories are not very descriptive and multiple categories can apply to a single use case
 - Continued dislike of offering "Home Gardening" as an option when these requests are classified as NRR. Increases transparency but takes time to vet and process.
- The Home Gardening option was discussed; people debated whether this option was effective. Marty mentioned that we probably receive less than 10 "HG" requests a month. He indicated that most home gardeners use some other category, but that their intended use explanation and the list of accessions is usually a strong clue.
 - O Jenny / Rachel: There is a very definite group of individuals that fall in the gray area of researchers. The extremely skilled hobby breeders, retired scientists and others do often have valid reasons to obtain the material yet they do not really fit in the commercial, state or government group. A lot fit in the non-profits but not always. This works when it is local but there are other nonprofit groups like the New York Nut Growers
 - Automate accession performance reporting (APR) feedback
 - Specific crops have questions that are relevant (hardiness zone, experience, perennial crops, etc.)
 - Personal connections within unconsolidated exchange groups increase response rates. Can their own magazine circulation be used to request feedback to the NPGS?
 - Trevis: MS form for feedback?

- What is useful for her to communicate outside of NPGS?
- How do our stakeholders ask for data to be summarized?
- Lisa, Vivian, Stacey and Jenny will meet with Neha next week to discuss.
- Accession level is the most granular level of detail that all "reporting crops" could be summarized at.
- Stacey: add "Reporting Crop" field to accession dataview? so curators can assign each accession to one "Crop" for reporting purposes without impact to existing genebank activities, crop trait descriptors, or other management techniques. Curators understand the needs of their stakeholders (IE: Soy has 11 maturity zones that could be summarized into 3 areas (Northern, Southern, Tropical) to meet most stakeholder needs.
